

#### GOSPEL REFLECTION



The unnamed women we meet in today's Gospel esson is not only unidentified to us but was probably unknown and unnamed in her own time and place. It is quite probable that no one noticed her as she

slipped into the Temple treasury to make her meager contribution; all that Mark tells us about her is that she was "a poor widow," a woman who had not only endured the loss of her husband but also the loss of financial support from his family. The way she is described—that the sum total of her wealth was "too small copper coins, which are worth a penny" (Mark 12:42)—testifies to the dire circumstances of a woman who is unnamed, unnoticed, and unloved. The widow's mite was truly a sign of the widow's might, her faith that gave her the courage to sacrifice whatever she possessed, trusting that all who place their confidence in God's steadfast love have the assurance that our Lord, who is the "help of the helpless," will indeed "abide with me."

#### RIFLESSIONE SUL VANGELO

La donna senza nome che incontriamo nel Vangelo di oggi non è solo sconosciuta a noi, ma probabilmente era ignota e senza nome anche nel suo tempo e luogo. È molto probabile che nessuno l'abbia notata mentre si avvicinava al tesoro del Tempio per fare la sua modesta offerta; tutto ciò che Marco ci dice di lei è che era "una povera vedova," una donna che non solo aveva subito la perdita del marito, ma anche la perdita del sostegno finanziario della sua famiglia. Il modo in cui viene descritta,

ovvero che il totale delle sue ricchezze era "due monetine, che fanno un soldo" (Marco 12,42), testimonia le circostanze disperate di una donna senza nome, inosservata e non amata. La piccola offerta della vedova era davvero un segno della sua grande fede, la sua fede che le dava il coraggio di sacrificare tutto ciò che possedeva, fidandosi che tutti coloro che pongono la loro fiducia nell'amore fedele di Dio hanno la certezza che il nostro Signore, che è il "soccorso di chi è senza aiuto," "rimarrà con me."
