Gospel Reflection – Matthew 5:13–16 In today’s Gospel, Jesus speaks with simple but powerful images. He calls us the salt of the earth and the light of the world. Salt is small, but it makes a big difference. It gives flavor and preserves what is good. Light does not make noise, but it quietly pushes away darkness and helps people find their way. Jesus reminds us that our faith is not meant to be hidden or kept only for ourselves. We are called to live our faith openly, not through big words, but through simple actions. When we are patient, kind, honest, forgiving, and caring, we allow God’s light to shine through us. Our good works are not meant to bring attention to ourselves, but to point others to God. By living the Gospel in everyday life, we help others see God’s love and give glory to our Heavenly Father.
Riflessione sul Vangelo – Matteo 5,13–16 Nel Vangelo di oggi, Gesù usa immagini semplici ma molto profonde. Ci chiama sale della terra e luce del mondo. Le nostre opere buone non servono a farci notare, ma ad aiutare gli altri a riconoscere la presenza di Dio e a rendere gloria al Padre nei cieli.

Marriage Sunday 2026: On the second Sunday of February each year, the Archdiocese of Toronto celebrates Marriage Sunday.

Reflection: Think of an example of a good marriage. The husband and wife go out of their way to do nice things for each other. They give of their time and energy without asking for anything in return. They are faithfully committed to their marriage and are ready to make sacrifices for the other. Some could say they are head over heels in love with one another, even after many years!

Does this describe your marriage?

When spouses exhibit marital behavior like this, they help us understand what it means that marriage is an image of God’s love. Husbands and wives are called to display those qualities of love that Christ Himself displayed on the Cross.

Put it into practice:

Pray: Read together 1 Corinthians 13, St. Paul’s hymn of love.

Reflect: Is your love for each other patient, kind, etc. (from the list in 1 Corinthians)? Where can you grow?

Do: Place a picture from your wedding day in a well-trafficked area of your home (if there’s not one already), and put on it or next to it the words, “We are called to be an image of God’s love.”

Prayer for Married Couples: Almighty and eternal God, You blessed the union of husband and wife So that we might reflect the union of Christ with his Church: look with kindness on us. Renew our marriage covenant. Increase your love in us and strengthen our bond of peace so that, [with our children], we may always rejoice
