# Gospel reflection: Lk 2: 16-21

The year opens in the name of the Mother of God. Mother of God is the most important title of Our Lady. To call Mary the Mother of God reminds us of this: God is close to humanity, even as a child



is close to the mother who bears him in her womb. Only one thing is said about the Mother of God: "Mary kept all these things, pondering them in her heart" (Lk 2:19). What were these things? They were joys and sorrows. On the one hand, the birth of Jesus, the love of Joseph, the visit of the shepherds, that radiant night. But on the other, an uncertain future, homelessness "because there was no place for them in the inn" (Lk 2:7), the desolation of

# **New Years Prayer**



Canon 534 §1 states that: "After a pastor has taken possession of his parish, he is obliged to apply a Mass for the people entrusted to him on each Sunday and holy day of obligation in his diocese." Every pastor is required to offer the Mass pro populo and it should be listed in the bulletin as either "pro populo," or "for the People of the Parish." The Mass pro populo is not to be combined with other intentions. Starting from January 2023, the 5.00 p.m. English mass will be set apart for Pro populo. We will not be taking any special intentions for this mass. You may offer your intentions for all other masses during weekdays and weekends.

#### **WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR PEACE**

"More wisdom from Pope Francis as we celebrate World Day of Prayer for Peace..."

Peace, which the angels proclaimed to the shepherds on Christmas night, is a profound aspiration for everyone...Among these whom I constantly keep in my thoughts and prayers, I would once again mention the over 250 million migrants worldwide, of whom 22.5 million are refugees. By practicing the virtue of prudence, government leaders should take practical measures to welcome, promote, protect, integrate and, "within the limits allowed by a correct understanding of the common good, to permit them to

become part of a new society."
